## STAFF TRAINING - FIRST AID



The Teachmergency Staff training took place in Zuberec, Slovakia. For four days, six teachers/trainers from Upper Secondary School of Chemistry Pardubice, four teachers/trainers from Fire fighters Training School (Vilnius) and three teachers/trainers from the University of Žilina (Žilina, UNIZA) were collaborating together on First Aid. Teachers/trainers with different experience, knowledge and work practice in rescue, surviving and first aid skills were sharing different work methods and systems, work experience in different environments. This training was conducted as a workshop with active and collaborative learning.

To share a wide range and amount of knowledge on first aid, the program was very intensive and organized on different topics (choking, chest injuries, asthma; CPR - adult/child, AED; CPR/BLS training on models). Workshops were organized and led by experienced trainers from UNIZA and with an associated partner - Slovak Red Cross - Region office Žilina.

This training gave an opportunity to meet teachers/ trainers from three different countries, to exchange good practices, to learn new methods and information, to work in different and unusual places, as well as to improve communication in the English language.

This training event was conducted in as a workshop and active and collaborative learning.

The training was organized and led by experienced trainers and in cooperation with Associated partner Pardubice region Fire brigade. Part of the training was located in a unique climbing polygon - The Education and Training Center of the Fire Protection Training Center in Velké Poříčí. Other activities were outside: in the mountains and ski resort Říčky in Orlické hory and Buková hora.

It was a unique opportunity for all the teachers/trainers and participants. The program was planned well, with a lot of activities, training and new good practice exchange. The participating trainers will include all the experience, and new or renewed information in their training to extend knowledge to colleagues and students. The diversity provided an opportunity to prepare new steps and examples in training techniques.

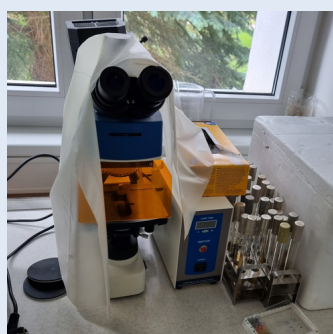
## PROJECT PROGRESS MEETING

Third Transnational meeting was held in Upper Secondary School of Chemistry Pardubice (SPSCH Pardubice) in Pardubice, Czech Republic, right after Staff training, on May 31 - June 1.
